Memory Verses for January of 2023

Memory work includes the reference spoken before and after the actual verse. Third grade and above should aim to memorize all five verses each month. Grades One and Two should aim to memorize three of the verses each month. Each child will recite his or her verses for an assigned adult. The adult will award prizes if the child has memorized the verses. Children should also be encouraged to find these verses in their own Bibles.

Psalm 28:7 — “The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and I am helped. My heart leaps for joy and I will give thanks to him in song.”— **Psalm 28:7**

Psalm 46:10 — “Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations. I will be exalted in the earth.” — **Psalm 46:10**

Isaiah 64:6 — “All of us have become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous acts are like filthy rags; we all shrivel up like a leaf, and like the wind our sins sweep us away.” — **Isaiah 64:6**

Matthew 11:28-30 — “Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.” — **Matthew 11:28-30**
