Advent Wreath Candle Robert and Laurel LeSuer

Lighting the Advent wreath originated in Germany, based on a Roman custom of the ceremonial entrance of a ruler to a province or city as his "advent" (from the Latin adventus, meaning "arrival"). One candle is lit the first Sunday of Advent, two are lit the second Sunday, etc. Each of the candles has special significance. The final candle, the Christ candle, is lit on Christmas Eve.

Liturgists:

Today we relight the three candles of the Advent Wreath-the candle of Hope, the candle of Peace, and the candle of Joy. Now we light the fourth candle of Advent. This is the candle of Love.

Jesus demonstrated self-giving love in his ministry as the Good Shepherd. Advent is a time for kindness, thinking of others and sharing with others. It is a time to love as God loved us by giving his most precious gift, his only son.

In John 13:34 Jesus said: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."
