Prayers of Confession Thomas Brooks

We will begin by praying a unison prayer of corporate confession.

Then, we will join in silently, confessing our personal sins.

Almighty God, You know our hearts. You know that we struggle to be faithful to You. From moment to moment, and from decision to decision, we are inconsistent and fickle.

Please hear us as we confess our sins. Please forgive us for our unfaithfulness. Please forgive us even more when we justify our unfaithfulness with formulas for our lives that serve us and not You. Assurance of Pardon (*responsively*) Thomas Brooks
