Prayers of Confession: Psalm 51 (*responsively*) Thomas Brooks

Liturgist: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love;

Congregation: according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.

Liturgist: Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

Congregation: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.

Liturgist: Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight;

Congregation: so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge.

Liturgist: Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me.

Congregation: Yet you desired faithfulness even in the womb; you taught me wisdom in that secret place.

Liturgist: Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean;

Congregation: wash me, and I will be whiter than snow.

Liturgist: Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice.

Congregation: Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity.

Liturgist: Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.

Congregation: Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me.

Liturgist: Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.

Congregation: Then I will teach transgressors your ways, so that sinners will turn back to you.

Liturgist: Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, you who are God my Savior, and my tongue will sing of your righteousness.

Congregation: Open my lips, Lord, and my mouth will declare your praise.

Liturgist: You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings.

Congregation: My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise.

Liturgist: May it please you to prosper Zion, to build up the walls of Jerusalem.

Congregation: Then you will delight in the sacrifices of the righteous, in burnt offerings offered whole; then bulls will be offered on your altar.

Note: The Congregation should please silently confess their sins.
