Distribution of the Bread: *The body of Christ, broken for you.*

(Please note that for Communion we use both
gluten-free and dairy-free bread or crackers.)

As you pass the bread/crackers, please say to the next person:
“The body of Christ, broken for you.”

Upon receipt of the bread, please hold it until all have been served,
so that we can partake of the bread together, as a sign of our oneness
in Christ and membership in His corporate body—the Christian Church.

Distribution of the Cup: *The blood of Christ, shed for you.*

(Please note that for Communion the juice
we use is non-alcoholic grape juice.)

As you pass the cup, please say to the next person:
“The blood of Christ, shed for you.”

Upon receipt of the cup, please hold it until all have been served,
so that we can partake of the cup together, as a sign of our oneness
in Christ and membership in His corporate body—the Christian Church.

rows for disposal of the used communion cups

Monthly Prayer Focus

During the month of February, the Session asks that you pray for the members of the Pastor Search Committee. They are tasked with finding a candidate to present to the Presbytery and eventually to the congregation as the next Pastor for Redeemer Presbyterian Church.

The members of the Pastor Search Committee include Joshua Stearns, who serves as the Chairman of the Committee, Matthew Steinkirchner, who serves as Secretary of the Committee, and Committee Members: Zachary Harvey, Robert LeSuer, Jaye Moelk, Marykay Stahl, and Dean Wilson.

Over the coming months, the Committee will prepare a *Church Information Form* (CIF)—an informational summary about Redeemer; receive *Pastor Information Forms* (PIFs) from individuals who respond to the CIF; listen to recordings of sermons from the candidates; and then finally meet and interview the candidates in person.

Please pray:

- That God will bring to light the candidate that He has already prepared to become our next Pastor, who will lead and grow Redeemer.
- For the Committee members to have a unity of spirit and purpose, as they go about their work.
- For the Committee members to have God-given discernment, so that they will understand the genuine needs of Redeemer.
- For the Holy Spirit's guidance in finding the right person to fill Redeemer's needs.
- For the families of Committee members to have patience because Committee work is time-consuming and requires time away from them.
