We will begin by praying a unison prayer of corporate confession.

"The body of Christ, broken for you."

Upon receipt of the bread, please hold it until all have been served, so that we can partake of the bread together, as a sign of our oneness in Christ and membership in His corporate body—the Christian Church.

Distribution of the Cup: *The blood of Christ, shed for you.*

(Please note that for Communion the juice we use is non-alcoholic grape juice.)

As you pass the cup, please say to the next person:
"The blood of Christ, shed for you."

Upon receipt of the cup, please hold it until all have been served, so that we can partake of the cup together, as a sign of our oneness in Christ and membership in His corporate body—the Christian Church.

Monthly Prayer Focus

This month we will pray for *EduNations* and its mission in Sierra Leone, West Africa. For many years, Redeemer has supported this mission to educate children in Christian schools and spread the Gospel. Construction is underway for the Mayatta Teachers' Quarters to provide housing for teachers. *EduNations* "inherited" this neglected Primary School from the Mayatta Village leadership and has been working hard to upgrade and improve the quality of education in this very poor village. Other things to specifically pray for include:

- Praise that an 11-year-old student, Alhaji Kamara, recovered after a snake bite, thanks to anti-venom at Caring Hands Clinic.
- Praise that student, Mabinty Kamara, has recovered from typhoid, after receiving treatment in Makeni.
- Pray for Esther, a 5th grade student now in a safe home, after abuse. Pray for healing and for justice to be pursued.
- Pray for the family of Fatu Kamara, a 5th grade student, who recently passed away due to an unknown illness.
- Pray for the team in Sierra Leone, including the new Country Director, Kandeh Koroma, and Educational Secretary, Michael Turay, along with other staff, as they travel to each of the communities over the coming weeks. Pray for safety, wisdom, and encouragement in their work.
